• A soil carbonation testing facility has been established to perform the large-scale (pseudo-field) demonstration of soil carbonation technology behind the Advanced Structure and Composite center (ASCC). The large soil box (2 m x 1 m x 0.6 m tall), testing materials (e.g. silty soils, lime and CO<sub>2</sub>) and equipment/instruments are on site to perform the carbonation testing. A site establishment photo is shown in Figure 1.
